Now on, Punjab ex-MLAs to get pension for only one term

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) government in Punjab on Saturday issued a notification giving pension to former MLAs only for one term after the governor Banwarilal Purohit gave his assent to the Bill limiting multiple pensions of the legislators in this regard.

Henceforth, a legislator would get only one pension of Rs 75,150 per month irrespective of the terms for which he or she gets elected. In a 117-member state assembly, there are about 300 former MLAs in Punjab who are drawing pension and a few of them getting monthly pensions as high as Rs 3 lakh or even more.

With this Act coming into force, the state government intends to save around Rs



19.53 crore annually. The AAP decision is in line with the demand it raised as the then principal opposition party during the previous

Congress-led government's tenure in the state.

The AAP which came to power after February state assembly election this year

registering a landslide win — 92 seats out of the total 117 — had passed the Punjab state legislature members (pension and medical facilities

regulation) amendment Bill, 2022, on June 30, last paving the way for a single pension of Rs 75,150 a month to each legislator irrespective of his or her terms of election.

While the chief minister Bhagwant Mann had announced the AAP government's plan to limit multiple pensions of the MLAs soon after he took charge in March this year, it took over four months for the Act to be notified.

It may be recalled that the governor had earlier refused to give his assent to an ordinance to this effect asking the government to instead bring a Bill in the budget session of the assembly which passed a Bill on June 30, last. The delay, however, cost the state exchequer a few crores of rupees as the former MLAs thus got multiple pensions till July.

Spending on health, education can't be freebies, says Stalin

Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M K Stalin on Saturday said the expenditure incurred by the government on education and health cannot be construed as freebies and stated such measures were being extended to the poor and those living in the fringes.

He also took an apparent swipe at Prime Minister Narendra Modi for opposing freebies but said he did not want to talk much about it as "it will become politics." In fact, the Supreme Court has said freebies and welfare schemes were different, Stalin said in an event at the Arunigai Kapaleeswarar Arts and Science College at his Kolathur constituency here.

"The expenditure on education and health cannot be freebies. Because education is about knowledge while



medicine relates to health. This government wants to implement adequate welfare schemes in both these sectors," he said.

Listing out the initiatives in Health and Education, including those delivered on doorsteps, Stalin said "these are not freebies (but) social welfare schemes." "These are implemented to benefit the poor and those in the fringes," he said.

In an apparent reference to Modi, Stalin said, "some people have now newly emerged with the advice there should be no freebies." "We are not bothered about that. If I talk more, it will become politics. So I don't want to talk more about this," he said.

Modi had recently said freebies are a spoke in India's effort to become self-reliant and also a burden on taxpayer and criticised some opposition parties for engaging in the politics of freebies.

Further, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman had hit out at Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal for giving a "perverse twist" to the debate on freebies, saying the AAP leader putting education and health in that category is an attempt to create fear in the minds of the poor.

One MLA - One Pension' will save Rs 100 crore taxpayers money in 5 years: AAP

The Aam Aadmi Party on Saturday said that the historic decision to implement 'One MLA-One Pension', in Punjab will put an end to waste of taxpayer's money, that was used by previous governments to fill the pockets of its legislators. The decision will save about Rs100 crore in five years; an amount that will now be used for the welfare of the people.

Addressing the media at the party headquarters here, AAP Punjab's chief spokesperson Malvinder Singh Kang said that for the first time in the history of the country, a government has stopped the distribution of 'revadis' to political leaders from public money. This is the true spirit of serving the

Taking a jibe at the BJP and the Congress, Kang said that providing free education and healthcare is not a freebie, but giving favours and waiving loans of corporate friends is certainly 'free ki revadi'.

Kang challenged the

Bharatiya Janata Party and the Congress who have their governments in most of the states to implement the same reform. "If they have the courage, they should also implement the 'One MLA-One Pension' in the states ruled by them to save public money being spent on the politicians.

AAP leaders welcome the decision

Meghalaya CM a puppet appointed by Delhi: TMC's Mukul Sangma

After Meghalaya's ruling National People's Party (NPP) announced it will go it alone in the Assembly election due next year, Leader of the Opposition Mukul Sangma alleged that Chief Minister Conrad K Sangma has been a "puppet" appointed by Delhi.

Conrad Sangma, also the NPP president, is heading a coalition government of which the BJP is a constituent.

"The NPP-led MDA government has been formed by PM Narendra Modi and Home Minister Amit Shah. CM Conrad Sangma is merely a puppet appointed by Delhi," Mukul Sangma said while addressing a party meeting at Mawshynrut town of West Khasi Hills district on Friday.

Meghalaya threw up a fractured mandate in the 2018 Assembly elections



with the Congress emerging as the largest party, marginally ahead of the NPP, an ally of the BJP at the Centre and in Manipur. The BJP and several other parties later stitched the Meghalaya Democratic Alliance (MDA) and formed the government in the state.

Mukul Sangma, a former chief minister who along with 11 other Congress MLAs joined the Trinamool Congress last year, claimed

that Shah persuaded Conrad Sangma to sign the border agreement with Assam, a BJP-ruled state.

Assam and Meghalaya on March 29 this year signed an agreement in New Delhi to end their five-decade-old border dispute in six of the 12 contested locations that often raised tension between the two states, with the Union home minister calling it a "historic day" for the North-eastern region.

Before that, the two North-eastern neighbours inked an MoU on January 29 to resolve the boundary problem in those six locations in the first phase.

Meghalaya's Opposition Chief Whip George B Lyngdoh had alleged that the state government has given away 66 acres of land in Ri-Bhoi district to Assam.

The CM, however, had informed the Assembly on March 15 that the 36.79 sq km of disputed area in these six areas will be shared almost equally by the two states.

AAP expanding exponentially in Haryana, says senior leader Sushil Gupta

The Aam Aadmi Party is expanding exponentially in Haryana and people consider it the only viable alternative that can pull the state out of the "mess" of corruption and unemployment, senior party leader Sushil Gupta said on Saturday.

Under attack from rival parties for promising freebies to people to "grab power", Gupta, who is the party's in-charge of Haryana, said giving basic facilities to the public such as health, edu-

cation, and electricity should be the government's primary responsibility and nobody should see any wrong in it.

The party's stupendous performance in neighboring Punjab earlier this year has come as a boost for its unit in Haryana, where it failed to taste success in the 2019 assembly polls.

"The AAP is now expanding exponentially in Haryana. We are setting up our unit in every village...people are looking at us as the only viable al-

ternative which can pull the state out of the mess of corruption and unemployment, and improve the state of health and education," Gupta, a Rajya Sabha MP, told PTI over the phone.

Several leaders from rival parties in Haryana had joined the AAP after its victory in the Punjab assembly polls earlier this year. Former Haryana Congress chief Ashok Tanwar, who had later switched over to the Trinamool Congress, and former Minister Nirmal Singh, were among those who

joined the party.

With polls in Haryana due nearly two years from now, Gupta said his party has already started preparations.

The party is working to build a strong cadre and looking to reorganise the state unit in the coming months.

Highlighting that unemployment was one of the biggest challenges in Haryana, Gupta said the AAP's state unit will hold a demonstration in Delhi on August 17 and demand the

Manohar Lal Khattar government to come up with a roadmap to generate jobs.

Gupta also hit out at the Congress claiming that it was busy with infighting and only the AAP was playing the role of opposition in the state.

He said the 2024 polls in Haryana is a direct fight between the BJP and the AAP.

"In villages, there is a strong undercurrent in favour of the AAP. Resentment against the BJP-led dispensation is visible.
