# Delhi-NCR air quality remains severe; students write to PM about pollution



New Delhi

Air quality in the nation capital remained in the severe category on Thursday as the Delhi-NCR region continued to be shrouded by a thick layer of toxic smog. Schools in the Delhi-NCR region remained closed as per the direction of the authorities Wednesday night. The closure of the schools was recommended by the Environment Pollution Control Authority (EPCA) citing hazardous air quality.

Several students, who remained confined indoors, chose not to celebrate Children's Day on Thursday.

Many students wrote letters to the prime minister

urging him to take measures to ensure clean air for them. "I used to enjoy soccer earlier but now I can only enjoy it on TV. I cannot play outside because the air is too toxic to breathe in," a student, Ishan Mahant, said in the letter.

Another student wrote, "At this point we need a

strong directive from the government of India and the governments of the states affected to control this serious condition. We do have belief in our beloved Prime Minister who will surely take strong decision on this."

The air quality index (AQI) deteriorated further to 463 at 2:30 pm in the city, three points more to what was recorded at 9:30 am.

The AQI monitoring centres at Dwarka Sector 8 recorded an AQI of 496, very close to the "severe plus" category. The AQI monitoring centres at JLN Stadium and Nehru Nagar also recorded air quality levels over 490.

# Centre not taking concrete steps to tackle air pollution despite SC direction: AAP

New Delhi

As the air quality in Delhi again deteriorated to alarming levels, the AAP on Thursday hit out at the Centre for not taking "concrete steps" to tackle pollution despite a Supreme Court direction to expedite deliberations to find a permanent solution to the problem.

The air quality remained in the severe category on Thursday and the Delhi-NCR region shrouded by a thick layer of toxic smog. It neared the "emergency" level for the second time in

a fortnight on Wednesday due to raging farm fires in neighbouring states and unfavourable weather.

Senior AAP leader Sanjay Singh alleged that the BJP is trying to "politicise" a sensitive issue like pollution and the Centre is not taking concrete steps to tackle the issue.

"The BJP, on the other hand, is trying to increase the pollution in the national capital. I think it is time that the Centre clarifies why no concrete steps are being taken despite the Supreme Court's direction,"

Singh told reporters.

He claimed that a meeting on pollution held by Environment Minister Prakash Javadekar was not attended by state environment ministers of Haryana, Punjab and Rajasthan.

"I request these ministers to show some seriousness towards the sensitive issue. Just to portray AAP in bad light, you are putting people at risk not only in Delhi but also in Punjab and Haryana who are suffering due to pollution by stubble burning," he said.

the Aya Nagar air quality monitoring centre which recorded an AQI of 382. The PM 2.5 and PM 10 levels were nearly eight times higher than the normal limits at several locations in the city. The levels of PM 2.5 - tiny particulate matter less than 2.5 microns in diameter - can enter deep into the lungs and even the bloodstream.

The AQI in the satellites cities of Delhi -- Faridabad (441), Ghaziabad (490), Greater Noida (470), Gurgaon (414) and Noida (486) -- was equally bad.

An AQI between 201 and 300 is considered 'poor', 301-400 'very poor' and

401-500 'severe', while the AQI above 500 falls in the severe plus category. The MeT department has predicted strong winds from Friday, which is expected to slightly bring down the air pollution.

On Wednesday, the EPCA had extended the restrictions on dirty-fuel based industries in Delhi-NCR, hot mix plants and stone crushers till the morning of November 15, as the MeT department had said strong winds are expected from Friday, which will bring down the air pollution levels to the very poor category.

# Delhi Cong seeks CBI inquiry into 'Green Tax' collection by Delhi govt

The Delhi Pradesh Congress Committee (DPCC) has sought a CBI inquiry into the various alleged corruption cases involving the Aam Aadmi Party Government in the name of ending air pollution in Delhi, like the purchase and distribution of masks for school children, and the financial benefits being extended to the AAP volunteers in the name of the odd-even traffic scheme.

Addressing a press conference here on Thursday DPCC president Subhash Chopra said that the Aam Aadmi Party government, which has collected Rs 1174.67 crore from the people as "Green Tax" since 2015 till now, has spent only Rs 272.51 crore so far, out of which Rs 265 crore were spent at the orders of the Supreme Court for the Delhi-Meerut Regional Rapid Transit

System.

Chopra said that the AAP Government spent just Rs 7 crore for the repair of the Delhi roads for pollution control, which was a big scam as the Delhi Government has no account of the expenses incurred. He said that around Rs 400 crores were lying with the Central Government and there is no information about that fund either.

He, making some startling disclosures, said that 63,142 children had died due to air pollution in 2017. He said that according to available statistics, 58 children face death every day in Delhi due to pollution. Shri Chopra said that despite this shocking revelation, the BJP Government at the Centre and the AAP Government in Delhi have not taken effective measure to control pollution in the capital.

# Objectionable messages found written on base of Vivekananda statue at JNU



New Delhi

Objectionable messages were found written on the pedestal of a yet to be unveiled statue of Swami Vivekananda on Thursday.

There was no immediate reaction from the varsity's administration over the incident, which came to light after a video went viral.

The statue, which is covered in a saffron-coloured cloth, is located at the varsity's administrative block.

Representatives of the Jawaharal Nehru University Students' Union (JNUSU) denied their involvement in the incident and said they will issue a statement soon.

On Wednesday, students had painted various messages for vice-chancellor

Mamidala Jagadesh Kumar inside the administration block of the university as they barged inside the building to talk to him about the hostel fee hike.

By evening, the fee hike saw a partial rollback and JNU said the clauses in the Draft Hostel Manual pertaining to the dress code and curfew timings were also removed.

Hundreds of students, led by the JNUSU, had barged inside the administration block to talk to the VC and on not finding him and other officials in the building, painted messages on the walls near his office.

"You are not our VC. Go back to your Sangh," they wrote on one of the doors to the VC's office.

# Police resume work at Tis Hazari court after 2 weeks, lawyers continue strike

New Delhi

Delhi Police Thursday resumed duty to look after the security at the Tis Hazari court premises after a gap of about two weeks following clashes with lawyers even as advocates continued to boycott work.

Deputy Commissioner of Police Monika Bhardwaj apprised District Judge Girish Kathpalia of the security status and informed him that police personnel have been deployed at the three entrances of the court premises.

Amidst apprehensions of a hostile environment, about 20 police personnel resumed work wearing civil dress instead of the uniform.

While being appointed at each of the entrances and the lockup area, where the alleged police firing incident had taken place during the clash, they were asked to apprise the senior officials if altercations take place between them and the lawyers.

Lawyers in all the six district courts in the national capital continued to boycott work completely on Thursday to protest against the clash at Tis Hazari court in early November, with proxy counsels appearing

in courts to take dates in matters and assist the litigants.

Hundreds of advocates marched on the streets near the Saket court, raising "We want justice" slogan and holding placards. Traffic was blocked and diverted for half an hour while they marched on the road.

Dhir Singh Kasana, general secretary of coordination committee of All District Courts Bar Associations in Delhi, said that advocates of all the district courts here will protest outside the Parliament on November 20.

Though lawyers are protesting peacefully, situation is tense as lawyers are still cautious about letting any advocate enter courtrooms.

A news agency journalist was stopped by a lawyer from entering a courtroom as he mistook her to be an advocate due to her attire. She was then followed inside the courtroom by two lawyers to ensure that she was not appearing in any case.

Important cases have been deferred due to non-appearance of counsels. The judgement in the case of alleged sexual and physical

assault of several girls at a shelter home in Bihar's Muzaffarpur was deferred for a month till December 12 as the 20 accused, who are currently lodged in Tihar central jail, could not be brought to court premises.

The fast track trial in the sensational 2017 Unnao rape case, which was to be heard on a day-today basis on the orders of the Supreme Court, also got affected as the accused, expelled BJP MLA Kuldeep Singh Sengar, and other co-accused could not be brought to court due to security reasons.

The strike continues as a meeting of members of all district courts associations, representatives of the Delhi Police and Lt Governor Anil Bajjal, held on Sunday on the orders of the Delhi High Court, failed to find a resolution, Kasana said.

The tension between police personnel and lawyers has been building up since November 2 when a clash over a parking dispute led to at least 20 security personnel and several advocates being injured.

Lawyers in six district courts have been on strike since November 4 to protest against the clash.

# Parliament to pass Bill for property rights of unauthorized colonies: Tiwari

A Bill will be brought in the winter session of the parliament to give ownership rights to the residents of unauthorized colonies residing in Delhi, state BJP president Manoj Tiwari said on Thursday.

Talking to the reporters at state BJP party office Mr Tiwari said that beginning of the registration process of plots against the residents will start at the end of this month once the Bill will be passed in the parliament.

"The Bill to regularize unauthorized colonies in Delhi will be placed in the

first week soon after the Parliament session will start on 18 November. The centre government will issue a notification directing all concerned department of Delhi. Then the registration process is expected to start by end of next month," Delhi BJP president Tiwari said.

The Union cabinet last month approved a proposal to grant ownership rights to people around 40 lakh people living in 1,797 unauthorized colonies in Delhi.

Properties will be registered floor wise in the name of the occupants with depositing a nominal fee at registrar offices, Mr Tiwari

said. "Kejriwal should help in the process of registration because the stamp duty collected in this process will go to the revenue department of Delhi government," Mr Tiwari claimed.

Ramesh Bidhuri and Hans Raj Hans, two BJP MPs from the national capital were also present at the press conference.

People living in rural areas will also get benefits now, Mr Bidhuri said adding that earlier there were disputes regarding the buildings constructed on agricultural land and litigations are pending in the court from decades. The dispute

has resolved now after the Union Cabinet passed the ownership rights last month, Bidhuri said.

He said, "The central government gave five years time to AAP party led Delhi government to take initiative but they failed to do so and finally PM Modi passed it in Cabinet and regularise it."

BJP MP Hans Raj Hans said that the objective of PM is to uplift the poor people and provide them social security.

"Residents of unauthorized in Delhi are staying in very miserable condition from last 40-years. No any political party took

interest to do this job for these people but our Prime Minister understood the felling and pains of these people and start working on to regularize colonies," Han Raj Hans said.

Meanwhile, former BJP president Vijay Goel today alleged by holding a placard at ITO Chowk that Kejriwal's odd even scheme is a drama and an 'election gimmick.'

Many people stopped their cars en route to tell Goel how odd-even is causing them great inconvenience, Goel claimed in a press statement.
